"Triple Aim" context for payment innovation

- Improving the patient experience of care (including quality and satisfaction);
- Improving the health of populations; and
- Reducing the per capita cost of health care.

Payment innovation in Medicaid is based on the premise that bridging socioeconomic barriers such as poverty, isolation, lack of education, unemployment, language, etc can improve health and lower health care costs.



Rhode Island Medicaid is a good example of payment innovation

Medicaid is evolving from Fee For Service payment to <u>value</u> <u>purchasing</u> with managed care organizations

Performance standards, goals, and incentives relevant to specific population(s) drive health plans to work with care providers

RIte Care (TANF moms and kids) focus on prenatal care and children's preventive care

Rhody Health Partners (adults with disabilities) focus on outreach and early identification of chronic medical or behavioral health issues



Health Plan Payment Innovation

Reimburse effective models of care delivery that support patients by bridging socioeconomic barriers. Use traditional FFS payment, per member per month enhancements, and performance-based rewards.
