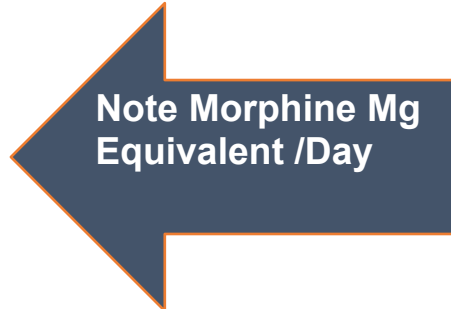

<b>Patient is going to multiple prescribers and multiple pharmacies</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- If not, time to do one. Find out why this is happening.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Are there other indicators?</li> <li>- Should I increase my monitoring, visits, urine drug screens, pill counts</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Ask about pain control and assess functional progress</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- This can be a symptom of addiction</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Evaluate the entire picture: consider referral for treatment for addiction/pain management</li> </ul>
